### 1) What is your favorite park memory?

- Spent a lot of time in parks, easy access to green space
- Bringing 1-year old daughter to see her dad play soccer
- Go as a family for play and exercise
- Hike and kayak out our backdoor
- BBQ and sports
- Park in Beijing with people using park to be physically active, focus on health and social connection
- Watching sunrise and set; felt welcome; enjoyed nature
- After rain filling up creeks and rivers; Slaughter Creek was full; swam; ate wild green onions that were sweet and delicious

# 2) What draws you and your friends and family to a park? And What kinds of benefits can a park bring to your community?

- Physically active
- Health
- Sports and play
- Experience in natural landscape and what the area used to be like
- Freedom
- Connection to natural world
- Community
- Equity Green space and nature trails that are available for all, especially in East Austin
- Grill, party, birthdays come together to celebrate
- Families are gathering under bridge at 183
- Fishing on southeast corner near river where bridge used to be
- Allow people to have access to river in natural space not just concrete
- Play with other kids; playground
- Govalle has new play space and is upgraded; draws more people and feels safer
- Programming, activities draw enough people to feel safe (currently where people have raves)
- Well lit
- Opportunities for running (window is small because either too dark or too hot)
- Connect with nature
- Inspire curiosity
- Students at LASA have Planet Earth Course were they study ecology and biology;
  Bolm could be a place they could engage with park, both in science and volunteering

#### 3) What's important for us to keep in mind when planning for Bolm Park?

- Concerns about lighting being intrusive in homes nearby; pay attention to lightshed (particularly for Knollwood homes in new section)
- Noise (late night soccer games or parties)
- Don't want a lot of sports fields focus should be on river
- Dark sky friendly lighting (well directed and shielded)
- Create a more natural experience
- River access, trails down to river this and Guerrero will be two parks with access to river and Guerrero trails are difficult to get down to river
- Interacting and learning about the river, access to the river, should be central
- Opportunity between Guerrero, access point under bridge and Johnny Trevino for kayakers and tubers for in/out points. Would be good to partner with signage to indicate there is a take out and parking (had problems with people parking in neighborhood. Colorado River Trail.
- Water quality monitoring should be part of this because of water treatment plant
- Need to be aware of industrial sites across the river so that we're thinking contextually because you can walk across river there
- Outreach on maintenance facility has not been good; disappointed it will be at that location
- Perhaps maintenance facility could be more rectangular and take more of 183 frontage instead of going deeper into the park
- Difficult to get in and out of the neighborhood. People go so fast (75 mph) on frontage road and pulling in and out feels very dangerous. Unless there is another road to get in and out, maintenance vehicles will be turning in there and its dangerous
- Traffic is a big issue
- Bolm East and Bolm West developments are happening, separated by water treatment area. They will have 1300 units each and we'll have a ton more traffic
- Maybe there's a way to create a two lane road on Levander Loop
- Don't want large events like ACL at the park because of traffic
- Consider traffic mitigation so it's safe to get in and out of park
- Need a bus route (at least to where Bolm Road reaches 183)
- Unhoused issues, similar to seeing at Parque Zaragoza. How can that be managed while treating people with dignity. Big place for drug use. Unhoused being preyed upon
- Under bridge at 183; in woods there is a sizeable encampment. Have concerns about drug and sanitation issues
