Q: What is the goal of the project?

A: The goal of the project is to document local architecture, history, and culture to promote heritage tourism. The project entails taking notes and digital photographs. All documentation will occur from the public right-of-way.

The project also will make recommendations regarding potential future City of Austin landmarks and historic districts, as well as National Register eligible individual properties and historic districts. This project will not undertake any efforts to designate City of Austin landmarks or historic districts, or to nominate individual properties or historic districts to the National Register. **No zoning changes will result from this project.** However, the project will provide information that will help citizens if they choose to designate a district or landmark.

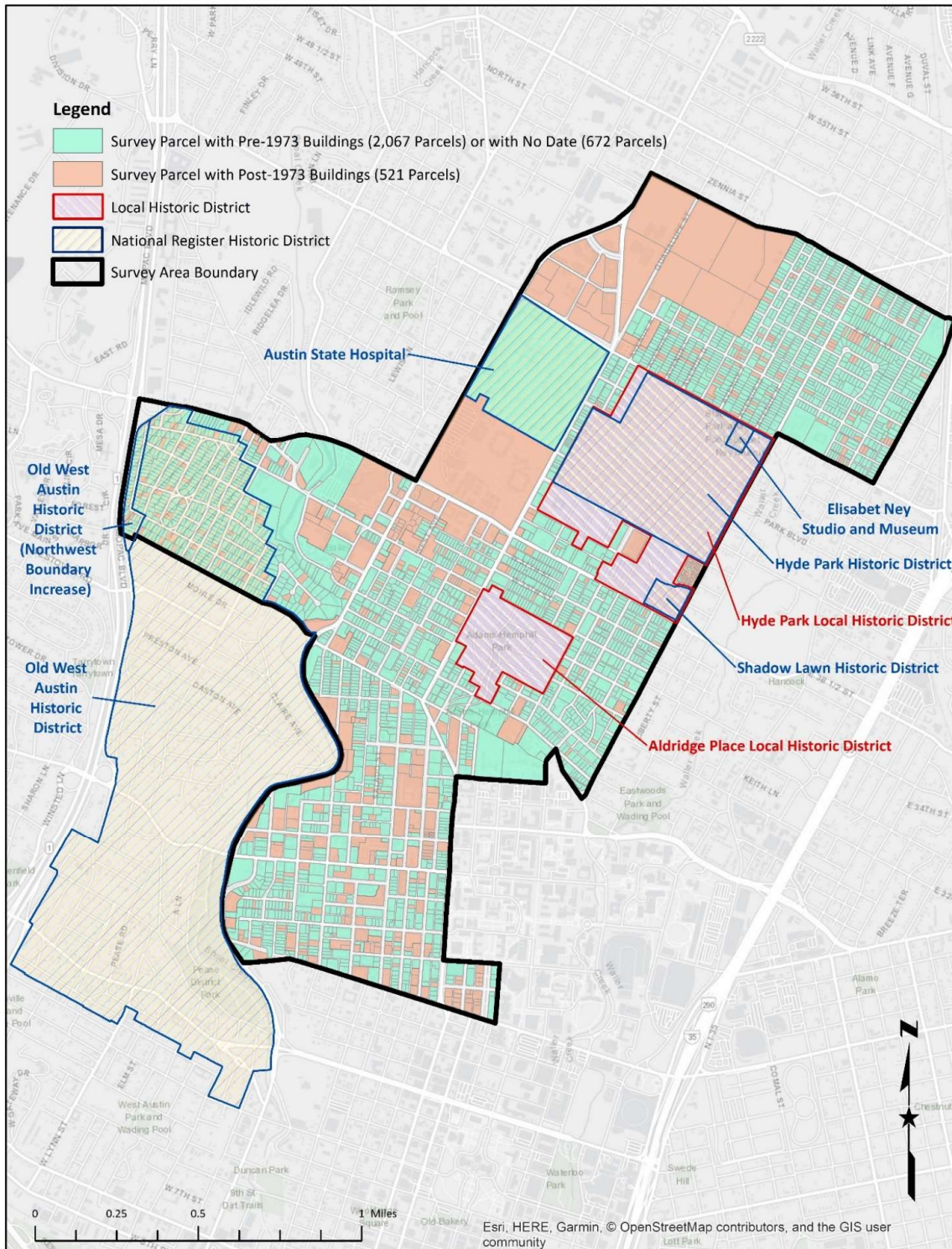


Figure 1. Map showing the boundaries of the survey area.
